9:30–10:30 a.m.	Keynote: Five Lessons Learned from Data-Based Individualization (DBI) Implementation Dr. Sarah Powell, Professor in the Department of Special Education at the University of Texas at Austin Over the last several years, Dr. Powell and colleagues have worked with elementary and middle school teachers on their implementation of data-based individualization in mathematics. Based on that work, Dr. Powell will discuss five lessons learned from these school-based efforts: (1) importance of teacher training on the instructional platform and common adaptations, (2) complexities of continual progress monitoring, (3) necessity of coaching about decision making, (4) timing of diagnostic data collection, and (5) structural elements that need to be in place at the school and district level.
